To create and promote social and educational activities for the recreation and leisure of High Legh residents. To maintain and manage a Community Centre.

The Charity is managed by the CA Council (CAC), normally elected annually at the AGM, and this is made up of volunteers from the Community, some of whom are also trustees. The CA Council meets 6 times a year and is responsible for running and maintaining the Village Hall, organizing Social Events for residents of the High Legh and fundraising. We raise money to do improvements in the Village Hall, to support other local social groups through financial grants and to publish this Newsletter 3 times a year.

High Legh Community Association NEWS UPDATE

Last Year started with the popular Robert Moffat 10k Race, an event run for the last 12 years in partnership with Lymm Runners and HLCA. It is a real community event with High Legh School, the PTA and many volunteers making it possible. Unfortunately, during the rest of 2020 due to Coronovirus restrictions and social distancing, many regular CA social events like Sunday Teas, the monthly Coffee and Friendship morning, and many other events were unable to take place.

Like many places the Village Hall had to close in March 2020. A lot planning and work went into making the Village Hall Covid-19 secure so we were able to reopen at the beginning of September and welcome back a limited number of users, including some of the exercise classes. However, due to the numbers of people allowed in the Hall and social distancing, many events like parties

and larger gatherings were still not allowed. Sadly at the end of the year, we went into tier 3, tier 4 and then lockdown and we had to close the Village Hall again. This has meant the Village Hall, which relies on its activities to fund itself, has received very little income this year.

However, 2020 did end on a high note with the Festival of Christmas Cheer which was promoted by the HLCA. Flyers were distributed by volunteers around the Village advertising the event as well as using our usual communication channels of What's On, website and notice boards. It was a big success and the many houses and gardens decorated with lights were a joy to see. Thank you to everyone who took part, and we will be running it again this December!

The first casualty of 2021 is the Robert Moffat 10k race which will not take place.





It was reluctantly decided at the end of last year to cancel the race and as it turns out the strict lockdown we are in now would have made it impossible to run but we hope everyone is out running ready for 2022!

The Village Hall also remains closed.



COVID-19

Thank you to all the parishioners who put lights up and decorated their houses for the Festival of Christmas Cheer and the Christmas Cracker Trail. They looked amazing. Maybe we can make it a yearly event!

Roads and Transport

A new solar powered Vehicle Activated Speed sign has been installed on the A50 in the 40mph zone between Crabtree Lane and the Village Hall and a new mobile Speed Indicator Device (SID) will soon be in use on West Lane.

We are working with CE Highways to get more signage to warn HGV drivers that there is a weight limit on Swineyard Lane, Golborne Lane and Moss Lane.

Inland Border Facility, Warrington

Councillors are concerned that the Inland Border Facility, where Shearings used to be, might bring extra traffic to Swineyard Lane. A councillor is working with a Warrington Borough Councillor about trying to get an ANPR camera on Swineyard Lane and HGV enforcement and has a meeting with the transport coordinator at IBF.

Cheshire Police will have dedicated Roads Policing Officers assigned to the area for the next three months. Before cameras can be installed evidence is needed, so please report any Inland Border complaints to complaints@warringtonibf@hmrc.gov.uk.

Please include as much detail as possible – who is involved, eg the driver or company name or the vehicle registration number, what the driver or company are doing, where they're doing it and when.

It's often helpful to take a photo if it is safe to do so.

HS2 and NPR

The Parish Council continues to monitor HS2 developments. We have written to Transport for the North to find out when they will be publishing the projected route of NPR, the design and environmental statements for a proposed route and plans for the necessary public consultations on these.

Planning Applications

The Planning Committee review all planning applications in High Legh. We recently supported Little Bollington in reducing the temporary time limit on the site compound at Bowdon roundabout.

High Legh Neighbourhood Plan

Work on the HLNP has progressed in the context of the necessary planning processes in spite of the Covid-19 restrictions (though the planning consultant who was helping us suffered a mountain biking accident in September which slowed things down, but we are so glad that he has made a recovery). Steps include:

- Cheshire East Council, in consultation with Natural England, Historic England and the Environment Agency, have undertaken a screening of whether the draft plan requires a Strategic Environmental Assessment and Habitat Regulations Assessment and have concluded that it does not.
- A Housing Needs Advice Report produced by CEC has been updated.
- Discussions on the draft plan have been taking place with Cheshire East Council's neighbourhood planning team.

A Design Code has been produced which is a design guide for the future development of High Legh village providing detail on the existing character and setting of the village and how future development could be integrated within it.

Once the final draft has been agreed by the Steering Group and the PC, and we have worked out how best to consult residents on the draft plan (subject to whatever Covid-19 restrictions will be) we will let you know more just as soon as we can.

First Responder

We are not aware of any First Responders in High Legh and wondered if anyone would be interested in becoming one. We have a defibrillator on the outside wall at the Village Hall and the school has one in their entrance hall.

Dogs

We have received complaints about dog fouling which seems to have got worse during lockdown. Please pick up after your dog and bag it. We have bins around the village.

Cycling and Walking

Over the period of the pandemic, we have all rediscovered the value of walking and cycling in and around our beautiful village. Individuals, couples, young and old including whole families have used the time to appreciate our surroundings by taking to our many paths and roads. During this time residents have voiced their concerns regarding safety on our local roads, both for ourselves and visitors to the village. Consequently, the Parish Council asked that some residents set up a working group to investigate improvements for now and the future. There are many initiatives being launched by national government and funds seem to be plentiful, our aim is to make sure High Legh can have its fair share; however, the funds will not come to us easily and we will need to provide convincing arguments.

We believe we need to start our work now. Here are a few morsels for residents to be aware of :- 1. A regular 'Wednesday' cycling group

(See the new Facebook Group 'High Legh Cycling and Walking for updates).

- 2. Published routes for 'walks for all' (In this issue)
- 3. Published routes for 'cycling for all' (In this issue)

In the background we will be identifying and corresponding with any organisation we believe will help benefit our goals. We will not act alone but will seek views from residents and will be responsible to the Parish Council.

In the meantime, please be aware of bicycles on our local roads. At this time of year, the

road surfaces can be slippery, and cyclists often give themselves a little extra room from the kerb to avoid danger. For a car driver the prospect of approaching a bicycle who seems to be causing an obstruction can be frustrating; 'chill.....hold back and give the cyclist's room', if there is one thing the pandemic has taught us, it is to take care of ourselves and others.



Walk for all: Circular Walk 3 miles

Overview

Follows a mix of quiet lanes, so no need to worry about being caught in deep mud. Care may be needed on blind bends from approaching cars.

Distance 3 miles

Quiet roads

Start: Ditchfield Lane, near High Legh Garden Centre

Route

Surfaces

Follow Ditchfield Lane heading East.

At the junction, turn left into Hoo Green Lane.

Follow Hoo Green Lane as it bends to the left up a slight hill and meets the A50.


Cross the A50 to the road that is almost opposite (Bucklow Hill Lane).


- Continue down Bucklow Hill Lane as it becomes Hulseheath Lane.
- Hulseheath Lane continues downhill on a gentle gradient, with Manchester on the horizon.
- At the T junction, turn left on to Chapel lane with several larger houses to the left.
- Walk towards the blind bends, you may need to change sides of the road to maintain good visibility.
- Ohapel lane then becomes Peacock Lane
- Turn on to Broadoak Lane with the golf course now on your right.
- At the T junction turn right on to Wrenshot lane
- Continue along Wrenshot lane until you reach the junction with Pheasant Walk, turn left on to Pheasant Walk
- Walk up the gentle hill and at the top turn left on to North Drive. At the top end of North Drive there is a passage that links to Woodlands Crescent.
- Walk down the passage and follow Woodlands
 Crescent as it begins to run parallel with the A50,
 eventually meeting it.
- Again, cross the A50 to complete your walk near to the Garden Centre.

Notes: Take care when crossing the A50 and use the crossing near the Village Hall. If you have younger children with you, it would be advisable to carry them across (with associated bikes).

When walking on Chapel Lane, it is best to walk in single file and make sure you are visible to cars as you approach the blind bends.

In total, this term, including all our #Claswars events and activities PTA has raised an absolutely jaw droppingly amazingly wow of £6,040!




We are so grateful to everyone within he High Legh Community that supported the Christmas Cracker Trail with such good spirits and joined in our Christmas raffle with such generosity.

Countryside Walking

During this lockdown period it is great to see local people walking the lanes of the village and perhaps exploring the local area more than they have done before. However, one thing that is noticeable is people walking on the wrong side of the road when there is no pavement, in that they walk in the direction they would drive, but in fact the Highway Code states we should on the right, facing the traffic. This is much safer as you can see what is approaching. Here is a reminder of what the highway code says...

Key points to remember:

- Use the pavement (including any path along the side of the road) where there is one Use safe crossings where possible and follow the Green Cross Code
- Help others to see you by wearing or carrying something bright or fluorescent
- Use reflective materials at night such as armbands, sashes or jackets Take special care with young children, pushchairs and non-powered wheelchairs

"What do when there is no pavement available"

Different rules for walkers apply when there is no pavement depending on the size of your group. Small groups should keep to the right-hand side of the road so you can see oncoming traffic. Keep close to the side of the road and be prepared to walk in single file. If you come across a sharp right-hand bend it may be safer to cross to the left-hand side of the road and cross back after the bend.

Large groups on organised walks should keep to the left when no pavement is available. There should be a look-out at the front and back of the group wearing fluorescent clothes in daylight and reflective clothes in the dark. At night, the front look-out should have a white light and the rear look-out a red light. People on the outside of large groups should also carry lights and wear reflective clothing.




























Positive experiences during lockdown

The "Great Conjunction" was in the news in December. This was the alignment of Jupiter and Saturn low in the sky. These two planets had been getting closer together over previous months and on 21st December, the winter solstice, they were lined up. As young friend of mine said "It's a line of sight thing" It was not easy to see as they were low in the south western sky just before dusk. By the time it was really dark they had set below the horizon. It was, though, the first time for over 400 years that these two planets had been this close together as seen from Earth.

This image was taken from Stellarium a few days before the conjunction. It shows Jupiter as a bright disc with Saturn the small bright dot just to left. The observatory remains closed for the present, but I was pleased to be able to do a reading for Rev..Trish Cope for the St John's on-line Christmas carol service. She did the recording outside the observatory dome. Our second Thursday meetings have been on hold, but we hope to be able to resume them in due course using zoom.

St John's Newsletter March 2021

Despite the restrictions in place High Legh did have some fun and we at St John's enjoyed participating in the Christmas Cracker Trail and the Festival of Cheer and it prompted us to expand our outdoor celebration of the season with a lit Christmas tree, star, crib and Advent wreath, Most of them will stay in place until Candlemas - more of that below.

We enjoyed filming the Community Christmas carols around the village and I hope that you have enjoyed watching it - it's still on St John's website. There's a real sense of place and atmosphere provided by the Bear's Paw inn, Paul Taylor's sheep farm and the HLCO as well as local musicians, Elizabeth Cox and Nicola Gerard.

Even Christmas day turned up trumps with a gorgeous sunny day so we were able to sing carols outside in the gorgeous weather in line with current restrictions.

However, we then moved into an even more difficult phase of this pandemic. We remain in a difficult situation – perhaps worse than last year when we couldn't see how long and dark the road aheadwould be.



This year we have greater knowledge, more therapies and more than a chink of light ahead with the roll-out of the vaccination programme. As we look ahead to a better year with these in place we can also see peeping through the cold snow and frozen ground hints of warmer weather and a brighter season to come. In our gardens and around the village in fields and hedgerows we sense an expectation of the colour that is to come in the many bulbs pushing up through the earth and especially the snowdrops - the earliest of the spring bulbs.

Snowdrops are sometimes called "Candlemas Bells" because their bowed heads suggest the purity of Mary who brought her baby Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem to give thanks for her safe delivery and to

dedicate her son to God. We celebrate this at church on 2nd February at Candlemas. Snowdrops are not native to Britain and were not widely grown until the sixteenth century and didn't occur in the wild until the eighteenth century. It is thought that Italian monks may have brought snowdrops to Britain in the fifteenth century to remind them of their Candlemas celebrations back at home. The tiny white flame-shaped bud is reminiscent of the candles of that celebration. As the first plant to flower towards the end of winter, the snowdrop is seen as a symbol of hope reflecting the hope that Christians have in the message of Jesus Christ; that love can never be overcome by evil.

In Russia March 1st is known as Snowdrop day. The legend tells of an angel creating the flowers as a sign of hope for Eve who was found weeping because of her expulsion from the garden of Eden. In Russia children gather bunches of the flower – also known there as "Tears of Winter Snow" - to give as a gift of hope and thanksgiving for the passing of winter.

I can't give you all a snowdrop but as you see them around the village be encouraged that, as well as winter, the worst of the impact of the Covid 19 pandemic may soon be over and that there is hope ahead.

As I write towards the end of January. Sunday services have been suspended and we cannot be sure when we will be able to resume. However, we are hopeful that we shall be able to celebrate Easter together in church and that it will be a day of hope for the whole nation – indeed the whole world. St John's remains the parish church for this village. Funerals can still be held and marriages and baptisms planned. More widely we remain a place of prayer and support for the village so if you have anything you would like to talk to us about please get in touch - St John's team is still here for you.




