## SPORTS, EDUCATION AND RECREATION FUND (SER FUND)

#### What is the Fund?

The SER Fund was established in 2015 to assist the Community Association facilitate the first of its two charitable objectives:- To create and promote social and educational activities for the recreation and leisure of High Legh residents. Since 2015 many groups and a few individuals in High Legh have benefited from the fund including the Observatory, School, Pre-school, Bowling Club, Tennis Club and more.

#### How much can be awarded?

Grants from the fund will normally be made up to a maximum of £250 and can be applied for annually.

#### Who can benefit?

Groups or individuals who live in High Legh and who have a project or a requirement for their group that will benefit residents in High Legh. e.g. purchase of or towards new equipment, training costs, or local projects. The most recent grant has been awarded to the High Legh Primary School PTA to go towards a wild flower meadow patch at the school.

## Criteria for Assessment of Applications

The proposed expenditure must be fully in accord with HLCA Charitable Objectives The benefit to "inhabitants of High Legh" must be clearly identified, and credibly deliverable by purchasing the item or items listed in the application. Grants can only be awarded for future expenditure, for the purpose described in the application and confirmed in the award letter.

#### **Application Process**

Written applications to our Treasurer, Su Carter at 11 Egerton WA16 6PT or by email to highleghcatreasurer@gmail.com can be made by 31st January, 30th April and 31st August each year. The level of grant awarded by the CAC will be notified within 45 days of these dates.

Applications should provide evidence that any proposed grants offers good value for money and delivers identified benefits.

There is no appeal process. The CAC decision is final.



### Where does the money come from?

The fund is financed by a % allocation of profit from social events organised by the HI CA.

The % allocation is determined at each year-

end dependent on unallocated reserves on hand.

The fund can be withdrawn at any time if the CAC is required to reallocate the funds to its second objective the upkeep of the Village Hall.

We are sorry to inform you that Gail Coenen has resigned from the Parish Council. We would like to thank Gail for the tremendous amount of work she has done for the parish over the last 10 years.

Gail has been Chairman, Vice Chairman and Chair of Finance as well as preparing reports on the A556 and HS2. We wish her well in the future. Cllr Will Hind is taking 6 months sabbatical for personal reasons. The councillors have appointed Cllr Matt Cooper as interim Chairman.

The vacancy was advertised and three

residents applied. Nigel Hennerley was co-opted onto the Council and the other two residents were offered non-voting co-option.

From the 7 May the PC can't meet virtually so our Annual Meeting on 17 May will be held in the main hall at the Village Hall.

## IMPORTANT NEXT STEP FOR THE DRAFT HIGH LEGH NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN



Between 12 April and 30 May another major milestone will be completed as the Parish Council undertakes the next phase of consultation on the draft High Legh Neighbourhood Plan and we would like to thank all of those who respond with their comments on the draft policies.

The responses will be assessed and a full consultation report completed prior to consideration of any changes that may need to be made to the Plan.

It's too early at the time of writing to give any more detailed feedback but it is important

to emphasise that the draft Plan contains policies NOT detailed proposals i.e once a final version is agreed it will set the framework for what can and cannot happen in High Legh.

The estimated timing of the next steps is therefore:

- Review and re-draft of the Plan following consultation responses (by September 2021);
- Submission of the plan to Cheshire East Council (by November 2021)

- Regulation 16 statutory 6 week consultation by Cheshire East Council (date to be confirmed);
- Independent examination (date to be confirmed); and
- Referendum and adoption (dates to be confirmed).
- It's been a long haul to get to where we are. Following the Parish Council's decision in 2013 to develop a Neighbourhood Plan, the Plan proposals have been developed after extensive consultations with High Legh residents, surveys and meetings over many years, combined with extensive reports and analysis to produce a draft Plan which we believe reflects the response of what the evidence is showing that the majority of High Legh residents want whilst aiming to take account of any concerns expressed. The draft Plan has been developed over several years following our analysis of feedback from earlier community engagement and evidence gathering and that is what will be the approach that we continue to take as the Plan goes through its final stages.

#### Roads and Transport

PC Lawrence Price attended the March meeting and reported on incidents in High Legh including an RTC at Peacock Lane and one at Pheasant Walk/West Lane when a motorcylist was badly injured.

The numbers of collisions was concerning and PC Price will share with Highways. PC Price was asked about a STOP sign at Peacock Lane and he will raise it with Highways. Cllr Sykes raised the problems we have with HGVs on Swineyard Lane. Motorbikes speeding on the A50—PC Price will try to allocate some time with the speed gun. We are hoping that with the police support CE will be able to implement what we have been asking for.

Concerns have been raised about the safety

of footpaths on the A50 and West Lane which we have reported to Cheshire East Highways. Since the introduction of the speed indicator signs and the traffic calming measures on the A50 the average speed has decreased.

The potholes on Pheasant Walk were reported last year and we are waiting for CE Highways to do Level 2 repairs which means covering a whole area rather than individual potholes. Cheshire East are piloting a scheme this financial year whereby parish councils can pay for any extra work, e.g. CE empty the gullys once a year and if we want them doing more often we will have to pay.

#### HS2 and NPR

Transport for the North have submitted statutory advice to the Government for NPR. The preferred route is via the centre of Warrington. Cllr Adams, Mr Hennerley and the Clerk attended an HS2 meeting on Construction Traffic with other local parish councils on 22 March. HS2 are working with Highways England to try to gain temporary direct access on the the A556 at Chapel Lane to take pressure off local roads.

#### Police

High Legh and Mobberley Community Policing Team is PC Lawrence Price and PCSO Emma Darroch. Surgery dates will be on the police noticeboard on the outside of the Village Hall.

pupils and adults. Cllr Steve Ruddock and I met with an officer from Cheshire East to discuss maintenance and some new equipment for the Play Area. Please let us know if you have any ideas.

As we announced in the Spring HLCA Newsletter, our Group will be running leisure cycle rides on the last Wednesday of the month starting from the Village Hall car park and taking circular routes of 20- 30km.

We will follow quiet lanes & some traffic-free trails which allow more sociable riding &

most importantly we will try to ensure tea & cake stops.

Rides are open to all ages / abilities and everyday bikes are suitable. Start times will be advised nearer the time but early afternoon is probably best. Duration around 2hrs.

### Young Leaders in Service (YLis) Gold Award

During the pandemic lockdown Misk got involved in lots of charity challenges achieving more than 250 hours of voluntary service. She has donated cakes to thank the NHS Heroes for their efforts treating Covid patients and over Christmas volunteered as one of Santa's elves at the Dunham Barn Santa's grotto where she baked and sold handmade crafted biscuits.



Misk has been honoured with her gold award for her outstanding achievement by Knutsford Lions who launched the YLis scheme in 2014.

Misk also has a 9-year-old sister Aya, who has cerebral palsy. The Cerebral Palsy affects Aya's lower limbs and balance where she was unable to cycle due to her brain injury which limits the messages transmitted from her brain to her legs. Misk supported Aya during an intensive physiotherapy course abroad and with sheer determination Aya learned to cycle and raised more than £1,500 for the Make A Wish charity after completing a 10k cycle marathon. Misk has now received a new logbook for the YLis Gold II award.



It was so lovely for all the children to be able to return to school with their friends during March. PTA has still not been able to hold any in person events but that doesn't mean there have not been things for children and families to enjoy and take part in.

During the Easter holidays children were invited to take part in an Easter Art Paper Plate Challenge to see what they could create as an Easter piece of Art out of a paper plate.

Mrs Jones ably judged all the wonderful entries and we were delighted to announce our fabulous Key Stage 1 winners Albert and Jennie, and Key Stage 2 winners Gabby and Aureya!

The PTA has also now planted our own wild flower meadow patch to play our part in green spaces and improving biodiversity such as insects and other invertebrates (including butterflies, bees, spiders and millipedes).







We're aware that 97% of wild flower meadow in Britain has been destroyed since 1945. There is a catastrophic decline in bees in Cheshire and they are vital to pollination and wish to teach children to live wild flowers and insects.and helping to build a sense of community between parents, children teachers, and the local High Legh community.



To establish the wild flower meadow patch successfully and as soon as possible, we have invested in a 'Meadowmat' which is similar to a roll of turf, except with wildflowers and has a blend of 31 native wildflowers and 3 grasses typically found in an old fashioned hay meadow.

We'd like to pass our thanks to High Legh Community Association for their support through a SER grant for the meadow. We continue with our fundraising target of £42k for a multiuse games area (MUGA) and still hope to be able to start work within the year all being well.

The remainder of the school year will hopefully allow a Summer Fair and a Summer raffle in July. We look forward to continuing our future journey of fun, fundraising and helping to build a sense of community between parents, children, teachers, and the local High Legh community.

This was 7 runs in 7 days to 7 destinations to toast her late brother, Al, on what would have been the week of his 43rd birthday. At each destination, which included Winsford, Didsbury and Prestbury, she met with various of her brother's friends to raise a glass in his memory.

Sandra has so far raised over £2,200 for Macmillan.

Thanks to Macmillan Cancer Support, we

were able to bring Al home to our house under the Hospice at Home scheme. He spent late July and early August sat in the sun in our garden with his family and friends surrounded by (socially-distanced!) love and laughter.'

Sandra was accompanied and supported on her runs by various Lymm Runner members, some of her brother's friends and, fortunately, a lot of lovely sunshine.



Each year the C.P.R.E. asks the public to do a star count to assess the amount of light pollution. This involves counting the number of stars visible to the naked eye in the constellation of Orion, not counting the brighter main stars. Our count was 9 stars which indicates moderate light pollution.

During the pandemic the observatory remains closed to the public, but we have been doing a little maintenance on site. Also, our second Thursday meetings are on hold also.

However there will be a partial solar eclipse in the morning of 10th June, and we plan to open the observatory for this if, of course, the sky is clear. Further information will be posted on our Facebook page and website. It's been noticeable that the skies have been clearer during the lockdown. Mark Holmes took advantage of clearer skies to obtain this image of a very thin crescent Moon.



It was fascinating to see the live TV coverage from NASA of the Perseverance rover landing on Mars and, as I write, the Ingenuity helicopter has just flown successfully on Jezero crater — a truly remarkable feat.

T here's nothing really to tell about WI. We haven't met since March 2020. The federation have organised speakers on Zoom for members to watch over the months.


I'm hoping in the next month or so we will be able to have a social meeting outside. Information will be forwarded to members as soon as the committee can discuss it.

### St. Johns Church

In the days between the National Day of Reflection on March 23rd and April 5th, approximately 500 ribbons were tied to the railings alongside the Woodland Walk and the gates at St John's church. Each one represented prayers for those who have died and those who mourn, prayers of thanks for those frontline staff who have kept essential services going, and prayers of hope for the future.

It was heart-warming to see the ribbons fluttering in the breeze. They were not only meaningful for those who tied them but also the many people who passed by, wondered and found themselves also reflecting on the past, present and future of this Covid 19 pandemic.

23rd March marked the anniversary of the first lockdown in 2020 – I'm sure that we had no idea what the year ahead held for us. March 2021 saw the first easing of the latest lockdown restrictions. At St John's we were just preparing to open up for public worship again and since then we have held regular worship and the weather has been kind enough to allow us to sing together outside. Sadly because of our current limited capacity, we could not accommodate everyone who wanted to attend on Easter Sunday.
