Time to get walking again!

At this time of year we start to think about the mud drying up and getting out to walk in the beautiful English Countryside again, but where to find new and interesting walks?

Walking in Cheshire has hundreds of walks to download and print, free, it also has books of walks, details of all the walking groups in the county and much more. Whether you want to walk on your own or with a group all the information is there in one place.

John Harris (the custodian of the website) said 'There is so much walking information on the web but it is difficult to find. Walking in Cambridgeshire (part of the Walking in England website - one for each county in England) has brought it together in one place so whether you are walking from home, or away on holiday, you will be able to find a walk suitable for you'.

With walks from half a mile to twelve miles plus long, and a note of suitability for pushchairs and wheelchairs, everyone can find a walk to enjoy.

T he High Legh Community Observatory is located at Abbey Leys Farm on Peacock lane, and is open to all in the community of any age – no annual fee or subscription. It is run by local enthusiasts and volunteers. In addition to observing sessions we hold meetings at St John's Church room on the second Thursday of each month. Contact John Anderson for further information.

We planned to end the year with our traditional Christmas astronomy quiz, but there were not enough present to run the quiz. I gave a short talk on the Mars Perseverance rover and how the landing was achieved, with an update on the first pass of the Bepi Colombo satellite past Mercury.

Our second Thursday meetings are paused for the moment, as are Friday night observing sessions at the observatory. This is a precautionary measure until we see how the pandemic restrictions work out.

It was most exciting to watch live coverage the launch of the James Webb space telescope on Christmas day. As I write it is approaching its location at the L2 point some 1.5 million kilometres from Earth. This is the position where the Sun, Moon and Earth gravity balance out and so is a stable location. Deployment of the sun shields and unfolding of the mirror segments have been successfully completed – all done autonomously – a remarkable feat . Lots of testing and calibration will follow before the first images are obtained in due course. These will be in the near infra red region of the spectrum, which is of great interest to professional astronomers.

The new fence panels round the compound, installed following storm Arwen, have been painted with preservative. Other minor maintenance jobs have been done.

We will keep you posted about our Thursday meetings and observing sessions on our website and Facebook pages. Hopefully we will be able to resume in the not too distant future.

Wednesdays there is a leisurely 1 hour 'coffee run' leaving at 9.15am from the library and finishing with a coffee for those who can stay.

On Tuesdays there is a Track session at Victoria Park, Warrington in the Winter and at Lymm High School playing fields in summer.

Very soon, on Tuesdays, the Social Whistle Run will be returning, leaving 7.00pm from Lymm Leisure Centre. Chatting essential.

A letter will be delivered to all affected residents with full details as usual.)

 Γ here are now just 9 of us on the High Legh Community Association Council. We are a small, friendly and dedicated group and we would welcome new members who would like to be involved.


WHAT DOES THE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION DO?



PLASTIC FREE HIGH LEGH



T he Parish Council are supporting the green agenda in several ways. One is working towards High Legh being as plastic free as possible, and are working towards plastic free acredditration.

Plastic Free Communities is a grassroots campaign that empowers and connects people in a shared journey to free where they live from avoidable, throwaway plastic; from beaches, rivers and green spaces, all the way back to the brands and businesses who create it.

It centres on five objectives to achieve the Plastic Free Communities award:

- 1. Working with the local council
- 2. Encouraging local businesses to reduce single use plastic
- 3. Signing up community groups, schools and organisations
- 4. Holding events and actions
- 5. Setting up a steering group to drive the movement

The campaign has also sparked a wave of new environment and sustainability initiatives across the UK, with 80% of respondents saying they are more aware of local and global environmental issues.

There is good evidence the campaign is having a positive impact on community cohesion too. People involved have a greater sense of feeling like they belong in their neighbourhood, 80% said they felt more connected to nature and their local environment, and they are considerably more likely to spend time outdoors than the population in general. There is also some evidence that the campaign contributes towards a healthy local economy, with 95% of respondents saying they make an effort to use local businesses, and 90% preferring to use businesses who have taken action on becoming plastic free.

Here in High Legh the plastic free sub group of the parish council are working with Abbey Leys Farmers Market, High Legh Garden Centre and High Legh Park Golf Club to reduce our impact on single use plastic. Contact the Clerk if you would like to get involved.



HS2 UPDATE

Introduction of the High Speed Rail (Crewe - Manchester) Bill

...a.......

The Government has introduced the High Speed Rail (Crewe – Manchester) Bill into Parliament to seek the powers to build and operate the next section of the HS2 route, between Crewe and Manchester, with a connection to the West Coast Main Line to serve stations in Scotland and the North-West. The Bill process could take a number of years. You can find out more about it at www.hs2.org.uk/crewe-manchester.

THIS WILL SEVERELY OUR PARISH AND VILLAGE IF SUCCESSFULLY APPROVED.

The Parish Council had the opportunity to make a response to the recent Government enquiry on the Integrated Rail Plan which includes HS2 and Northern Powerehouse Rail. You can find out more by visiting www.hs2.org.uk/crewe-manchester.

The Parish Council have responded to the enquiry on the following lines:

- Local impacts which would be severe both during construction and subsequent operation
- Serving the community HS2 would be destructive to our community – separating locals and while rail improvements are needed the consequential issues around logistics and road use would further impact High Legh
- Levelling up HS2 would do little to level up communities across the North, who would need better connections between them rather than enabling a large inflexible drain pulling individuals to London and the South East
- Value for money destruction of prime agricultural land and the potential need to overcome the numerous complex geological

issues around this part of Cheshire does not represent any value when existing rail networks could be improved or restored to their former capacity before Beeching Cuts

 Climate and environment – clearly this would have a major negative impact at a time when biodiversity and reduction in carbon footprints are needed

High Legh Parish Council will continue to oppose plans for HS2:

- We are entirely opposed to HS2 and have always said that the route is ill advised and a waste of both money and a massive destruction of the environment and that it would only ever produce marginal improvements – particularly when there is more rail bed on the west coast mainline that can be used and an improvement to that infrastructure would be more cost effective
- If HS2 does go ahead then we will engage fully with them to push for as many mitigations to both the disruption of development and the impacts of the final piece, but this will need your support

Job Description for the Treasurer of High Legh Community Association

High Legh Community Association need to recruit a new treasurer to replace our retiring Treasurer. This is an unpaid, voluntary post, but one that can provide a great deal of satisfaction. This would suit anyone who would like to get more involved with their local community. Time commitment is only a few hours a month, a little more at year end.

It involves working with a small committee of volunteers who perform important roles in managing the Village Hall, fund raising and organising events for the High Legh community.

Main responsibilities of the Treasurer are:

- Oversee the Finances of the Community Association, ensuring proper records are kept and that effective financial procedures are in place.
- Manage regular online bank transactions and undertake bookkeeping duties.
- Regularly report the financial position at committee meetings. (approx 4x per year).
- Liaise with committee members, volunteers and contractors when required.
- Make fellow committee members aware of their financial obligations and take a lead in interpreting financial data to them.
- Oversee the production of an annual budget in partnership with the committee and propose its adoption at the last meeting of the previous financial year.

Skills

- Appraising the financial viability of plans and proposals.
- Ability to produce spreadsheets and reports.
- Knowledge of bookkeeping and financial management (as necessary).
- Good financial analysis skills.
- Ability to communicate clearly.
- Lead on appointing and liaising with auditors/ an independent examiner.

A handover period is envisaged to ensure a smooth transition and to allow for training.

The first W.I had been formed in Anglesey in 1915 and the Cheshire Federation in 1920, so High Legh was one of the very early WI's formed. In fact there were only twelve in Cheshire before 1922, and in 1922 seven more. There are now 198 WI's in the Cheshire Federation, so it was quite an achievement for those High Legh Ladies.

The aims of Women's Institute is to 'advance the education of women and girls for the public benefit in all areas including local, national and international issues of political and social importance, music, drama and other cultural subjects.'

At meetings, this gives members a chance to meet up in person, try new activities, listen to speakers and campaign on issues that matter to them. At High Legh we hold eleven meetings during the year, each with a different topic or theme.

During my time in W.I. I have learnt to Windsurf, had a trip around the red - light district in Amsterdam (with a guide!), worked a potters wheel, visited Monet's garden and learnt to ice a Christmas cake including fancy frills!

"A W.I. membership gives you friendship, and a place for self-expression. Each W.I. is unique and shaped by its members."



Over the years the Women's Institute have campaigned for 'sufficient supply of housing', Women on Jury service, Increase for women in the police, Equal pay for equal work, Keep Britain Tidy, Restrict smoking in public places, Routine smear tests for cervical cancer, Plastic in the environment, HIV and AIDS Awareness, Fairtrade, Care not custody and more Midwives.

ROAD SAFETY

F ollowing representations on safety on the A50 made by parishioners the Parish Council wrote to CE Highways expressing the concerns and asking for a Safety Audit. CE responded as follows:

"It should be noted that the A50 is a main A class distributor road which is part of the major highway network and as a result, there will be a variety of vehicles which regularly use it, therefore the number of HGVs using the A50 is likely to be high. Any concerns regarding speeding vehicles should be reported to Cheshire Constabulary.

As you are aware a safety scheme was introduced on the A50 in High Legh recently. Regarding your request for a safety audit to be carried out, we can advise that safety audits are carried out only when there has been a physical change to the highway. We can advise that we have also passed your concerns to our maintenance department to see if any siding out to widen the footway would be considered. They have advised that they will consider the location however, the maintenance budget for this is very slim in comparison to the demand. This location has now been added to a list for consideration. If any immediate action for safety purposes is required, then this will be followed up with the resources that are available."

VILLAGE HEDGES

Please keep your hedges and shrubs that overhang pavements trimmed to keep pavements clear so they are safe to walk on.

PARKING ON THE PAVEMENT - WEST LANE

In addition to hedges and verges reducing pavement space, we have received many complaints about cars parking on the pedestrian pavement on West Lane between Wrenshot Lane and the Village Hall. This is a key walking route to the school, parking on the pavement forces pedestrians including children and those with pushchairs to walk out into the road, which is a substantial hazard. Pedestrian pavements should be left clear for pedestrians, pushchairs and other legitimate users – failure to do so is classed as an obstruction and Cheshire Constabulary will now be conducting spot checks.

ROAD SIGNS

Some warning road signs which have disappeared and not been replaced by CE have been ordered and funded by the parish council. In addition the Parish are also replacing some signs that were erected but the wrong size. You can report any Highways problems and streetlights out on **fixmystreet.cheshireeast.gov.uk**

HIGH LEGH VILLAGE PLAY AREA

We have been working with Ansa (grounds maintenance company of Cheshire East) to release some funding we have towards play equipment. We are hoping to have two new pieces of equipment installed in the Spring.

LAND ON CORNER OF PHEASANT WALK AND NORTH DRIVE

This piece of land was put up for sale by auction on 8 December. The Clerk received many comments on this and the PC was successful in securing a TPO for the willow tree, ordered by CE's Arboricultural Officer on 3 December. If you are aware of any other plots of land owned by the same company then please let the Clerk know and we will ask the HLNP Steering Committee to designate them in the NP as protected green spaces for their amenity and visual value to the village, and that development applications will be unlikely to succeed.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

CONSULTATION FOR HYNET NORTH WEST HYDROGEN PIPELINE

which passes through High Legh Cadent has launched a consultation for its HyNet North West Hydrogen Pipeline a new underground hydrogen pipeline that will help decarbonise the North West. The consultation will run for six weeks from 00:01 on 26 January 2022 until 23:59 on 11 March 2022. To encourage people to get involved, they have set up a dedicated website (www.hynethydrogenpipeline.co.uk) that contains all of the consultation information and an online feedback form Cadent has identified a route corridor within which the pipeline could be routed, which includes branches from a central hub north of Northwich, to St Helens, Partington, Stanlow and an existing storage facility south of Northwich. The main aim of the consultation is to give local people a chance to learn more about the proposals and provide any information that might help develop the best possible route for the new pipeline within the route corridors.





